Open Scribo and carefully copy the provided story starter exactly as given. Do not change any words yet — just get it in place.

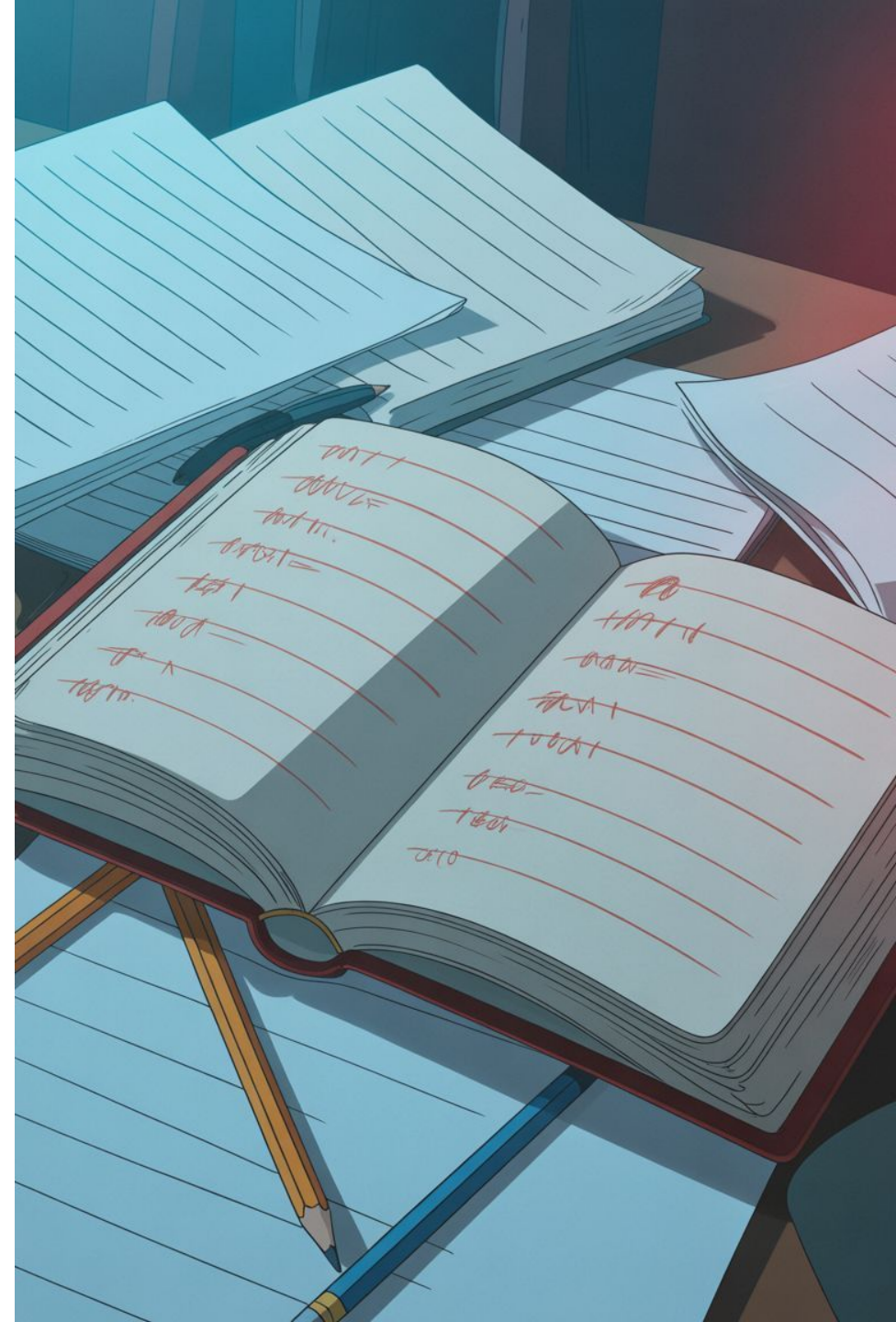
Three Editing Passes

Complete all three required editing passes. Each pass targets different elements: grammar, word choice, and sentence fluency. Do not skip any pass.

Improve Before Writing

The story starter must be polished and corrected before you continue writing. Strong editing is the foundation of strong writing.



Part B — Continue the Story

Your Writing Target

Write between 350 and 450 words to continue the story naturally from where the starter ends. Your writing should flow seamlessly — a reader should not be able to tell where the starter stops and your writing begins.

What Strong Writing Looks Like



Required Keywords

Include every required keyword from the unit. Place them naturally within your story — do not force them in awkwardly.



Strong Verbs

Replace weak or vague verbs with precise, powerful action words that bring your story to life.



Sentence Variety

Mix short punchy sentences with longer, flowing ones. Vary your sentence openings to maintain rhythm and reader interest.



Accurate Grammar

Apply everything from this unit — punctuation, agreement, tense consistency, and correct word usage throughout.

Assessment Rules

Work Independently

This is a solo assessment. Do not discuss your work, share screens, or ask classmates for help.



AI is Disabled

AI suggestions have been turned off in Scribo. Your writing must be entirely your own thinking and your own words.



No Copy & Paste

Copy and paste are disabled. Type everything manually — this ensures your editing and writing are genuine and practiced.



Proofread First

Before you hit submit, read your work from beginning to end. Catch any last errors — a final read-through makes a real difference.
