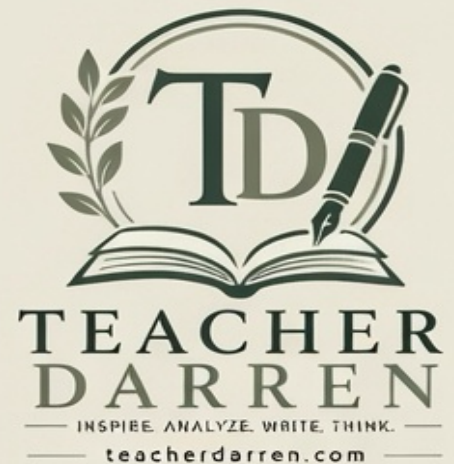

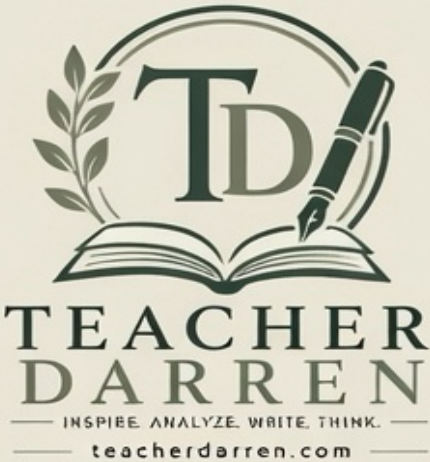

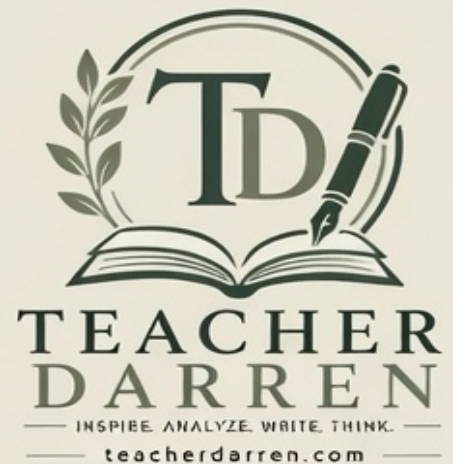

Teacher Notes

The purpose of Module 1 is not to teach summary writing itself.

The purpose is to teach students to answer the correct question.

Many weak Cambridge candidates lose marks because they include:

X disadvantages

X background information

X personal opinions

X irrelevant details

Strong candidates first identify the focus and then filter every piece of information through a simple question:

“Does this answer the question?”

If the answer is no, it does not belong in the summary.

This skill will be used repeatedly throughout Modules 2–6.

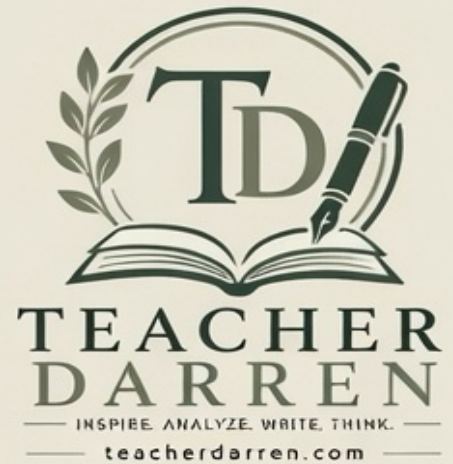

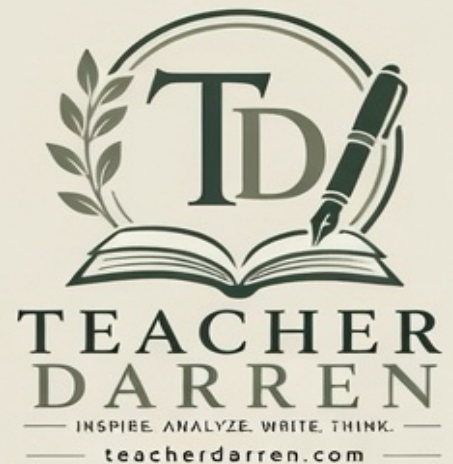

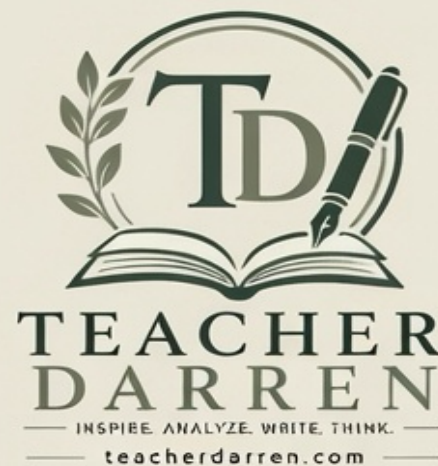

The Next Step

Now it is time to begin writing.

A Common Mistake

Many students think summary writing means turning every note into a separate sentence.

Example:

- meet friendly locals
- receive help from cyclists
- build confidence
- enjoy wildlife

Weak Summary:

People meet friendly locals. They receive help from cyclists. They build confidence. They enjoy wildlife.

Although this is accurate, it sounds repetitive and simplistic.

Strong summary writers combine ideas.

Combining Notes into Sentences

Example

Notes:

- welcoming locals
- helpful cyclists

Weak Summary Sentence:

Cyclists meet welcoming locals. Cyclists also meet helpful cyclists.

Better Summary Sentence:

Cycle touring provides opportunities to meet friendly and supportive people.

Notice:

- ✓ shorter
- ✓ smoother
- ✓ combines ideas
- ✓ sounds more formal

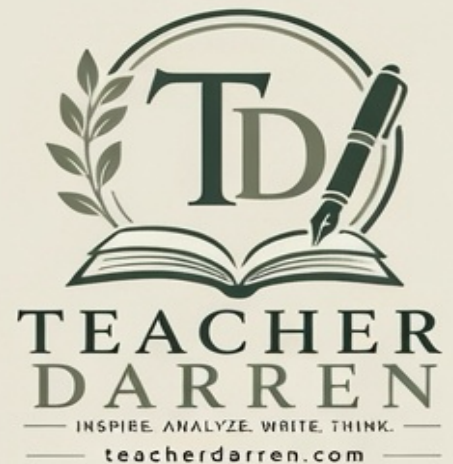

Mistake 1: Including Disadvantages

Wrong:

“Cycle touring can be boring and cyclists may worry about broken bicycles.”

These are NOT attractions.

Mistake 2: Copying the Text

Wrong:

“We discover that we’re capable of so much more than we ever thought possible.”

This is copied from the passage.

Better:

“Travellers develop confidence and discover their strengths.”

Mistake 3: Listing Notes

Wrong:

“Friendly locals, cyclists, villages, meals and wildlife.”

This is a list.

Better:

“Cycle touring allows travellers to meet friendly people, explore local communities and enjoy nature.”

Better Summary:

Error 3: Listing

Weak:

“Villages, meals, locals, cyclists, flowers and animals.”

Better:

“Travellers can experience local culture, meet friendly people, and appreciate nature.”
